The First Communion



Every soul is precious. The Bible tells us that *"there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner that repenteth"* Luke 15:10.

At PP, the entire congregation exists for those who are not members. Every effort is made so that we may share the good news with others.

So it is no great wonder that when a person decides to obey the Lord in baptism, careful attention and effort is made to ensure the new convert is given every opportunity to grow in Christ Jesus.

Starting at baptism, if the respondent's father is a Christian, he will be asked to do the honours on this significant occasion. If not, a zone elder will be given the privilege.

On the following Sunday, at his first communion, his zone elder will serve him the Lord's Supper before the rest of the congregation. From this day, an important relationship is established between the new Christian and his spiritual mentor, one that might last for the rest of his life.

New members - whether baptised or transferred from another congregation are then urged to attend Sunday Bible classes regularly and be part of an existing Care team.

But going back to “blind faith”, it was to be when we were given the Let's Start Talking book. It was supposed to be a one-to-one teaching of English using Bible stories. Suddenly, (though I had given tuition before), I didn't know if I could handle this task ahead, or whether I could answer their questions on the Christian faith, should they surface. In fact, Kenneth and I had planned to coach two students together, but circumstance would have it that this was not to be so. As such, again I have no choice but to do my best and leave the outcome to God.

And yes, it was to be a session that not only went well, I did enjoy the process myself...! It's hard to describe, but somehow, it was also “humbling” for me in the sense that God continues to demonstrate how great He is and that He desires for us only to do His will, not to worry about the outcome.



On the second day of the trip, I had already “declared” that I was very glad I came for the trip. The friendships I made in the trip, the love I saw extended to one another, the songs we sang together... all these affirmed in Christian Experience 101 that God cares for our well-being, and He is sufficient for our needs. Yes... He is an awesome God we serve and I'm grateful and privileged to be on this trip.
